ACW meets at Grace Lutheran Church (1245 6th Ave W), usually on the fourth Monday of most months. The meeting starts with social time at 6pm and continues at 6:30 with announcements, Show-and-Tell of member projects, and a woodworking presentation.



The club hosts a variety of classes on woodworking throughout the year. Past presentations have included tool sharpening, finishing, marquetry, woodturning and decoy carving.

Tools include table saws, band saws, lathes, scroll saws, a planer and jointer, drill presses, router tools including a CNC, sanders, hand tools and workbenches.


Shop safety is emphasized. New members must be certified by a shop supervisor on each power tool before starting a project.
